Log Cabin Camp ACTIVITIES INSTRUCTIONS

PHOTO FIND

DESCRIPTION

Use your skills of observation and the cryptic clues to find where these photos were taken around the Log Cabin Camp property.

Work with a buddy and see how many you can find in the allocated time. Keep your eyes open while you wander around, so you don't miss anything!

INSTRUCTIONS

Photo Find is commonly a large group activity with an Instructor/Leader required for each group.

- 1. Activity Leader should collect equipment from camp staff and proceed with group to the starting point which can be the Main Hall, Verandah or under the Shade Sails.
- 2. Participants can work in pairs or groups of three.
- 3. Activity Leader should instruct each group that they must locate and identify the item shown on the photo card, with the help of the clue. Leaders should remind participants not to leave the camp property or cross any fences.
- 4. Each pair takes one of the 25 photo cards and reads the clue, then heads off with the card to find the answer.
- 5. When item found, answers is written on their answer sheet and photo card is returned and another taken, until all are found, or time runs out.
- 6. When all groups (including all individuals within groups) have returned, scores should then be collated and then winners can be nominated.
- 7. Activity Leader with groups should then return all equipment to a Log Cabin Camp staff member.

LOCATION

All photos are located within the boundary of the Log Cabin Camp. The starting point should be somewhere central, like the verandah at the end of the main hall.

AGE SUITABILITY

Any age with competent adult supervision at all times.

RATIO

1:10. - it is recommended that there is one instructor/leader per 10-15 participants.

INSTRUCTOR EXPERIENCE

Instructors must have had previous experience instructing and supervising small groups in recreation activities.

ASSISTING LEADERS EXPERIENCE

No previous experience is required for assisting leaders, however basic skills in map reading are required.

PARTICIPANT EXPERIENCE

No previous experience in the activity is required. Level of difficulty suitable for Primary School students.

INSTRUCTOR RESPONSIBILITY

The Instructor is responsible for camper supervision and behaviour at all times, this includes the supervision and behaviour of campers at the activity and to and from the activity. The instructor is also responsible for:-

- > Ensuring first aid requirements are met.
- > Briefing participants and leaders on rules and requirements of activity.
- Ensuring that all the equipment is returned to the program room at the end of the activity.

PARTICIPANTS RESPONSIBILITY

Participants are responsible for adhering to the instructions of the instructor.

ASSISTING LEADERS/INSTRUCTORS RESPONSIBILITY

Leaders will be responsible for the supervision, behaviour and safety of the participants.

PARTICIPANTS CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES

Clothing suitable for weather conditions, solid footwear, sunscreen, sun hat, and water (when necessary)

FIRST AID REQUIREMENTS

Seek qualified First Aid person if need arises.
